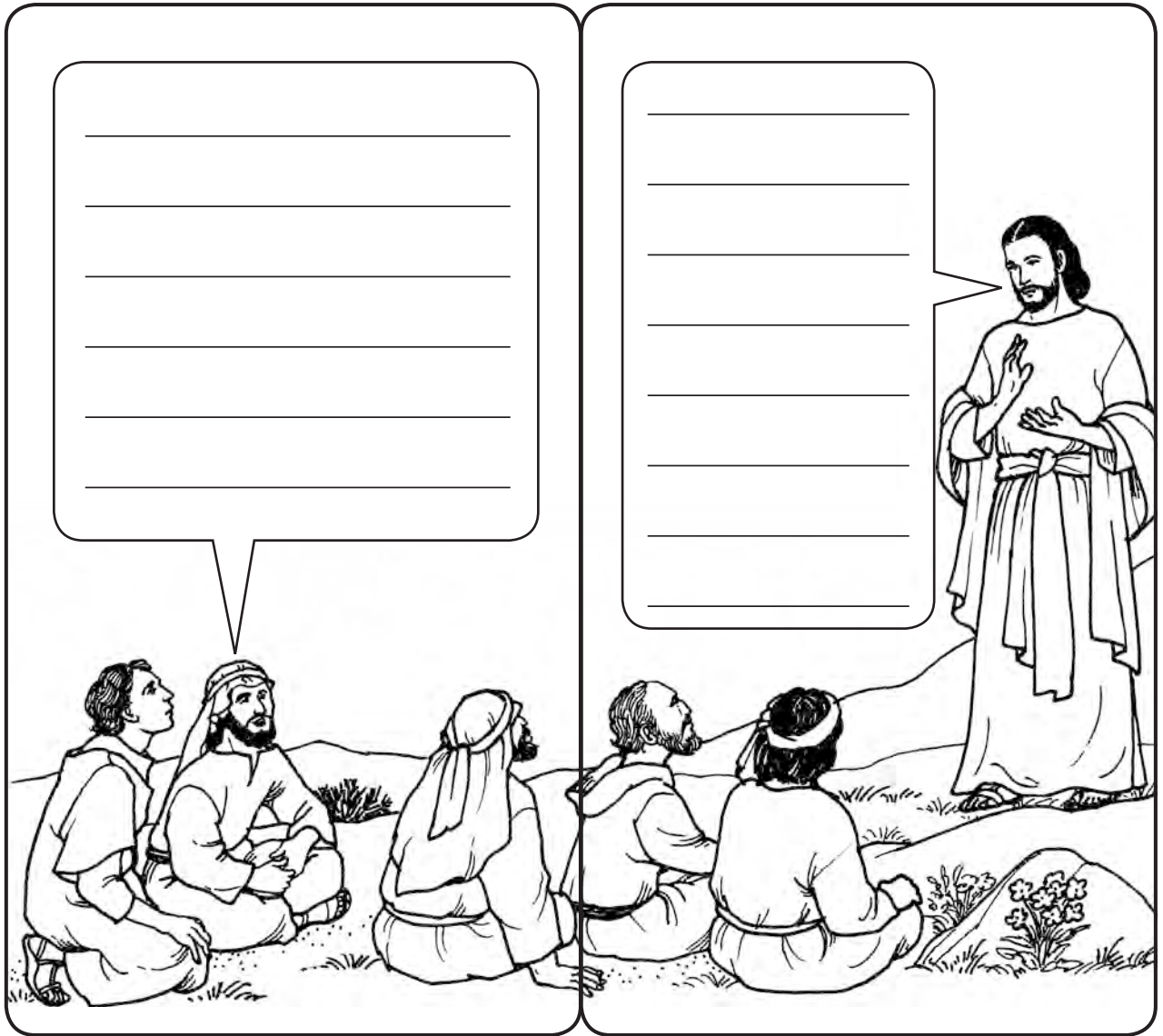




# Luke 17:5–6
