We get along.

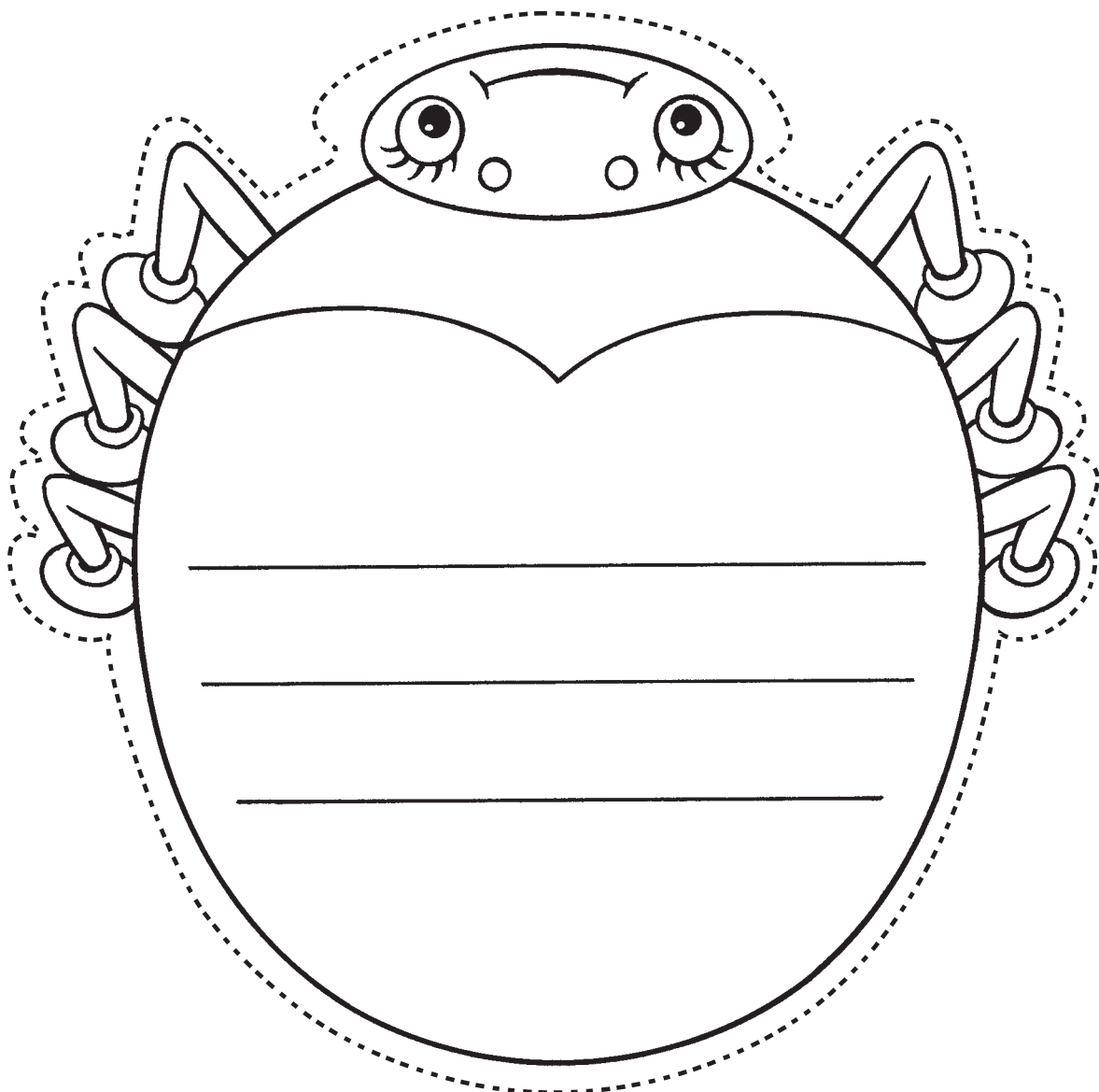


Love Bug

5. Poke a craft stem through the holes. Twist the stem to make antennae.
