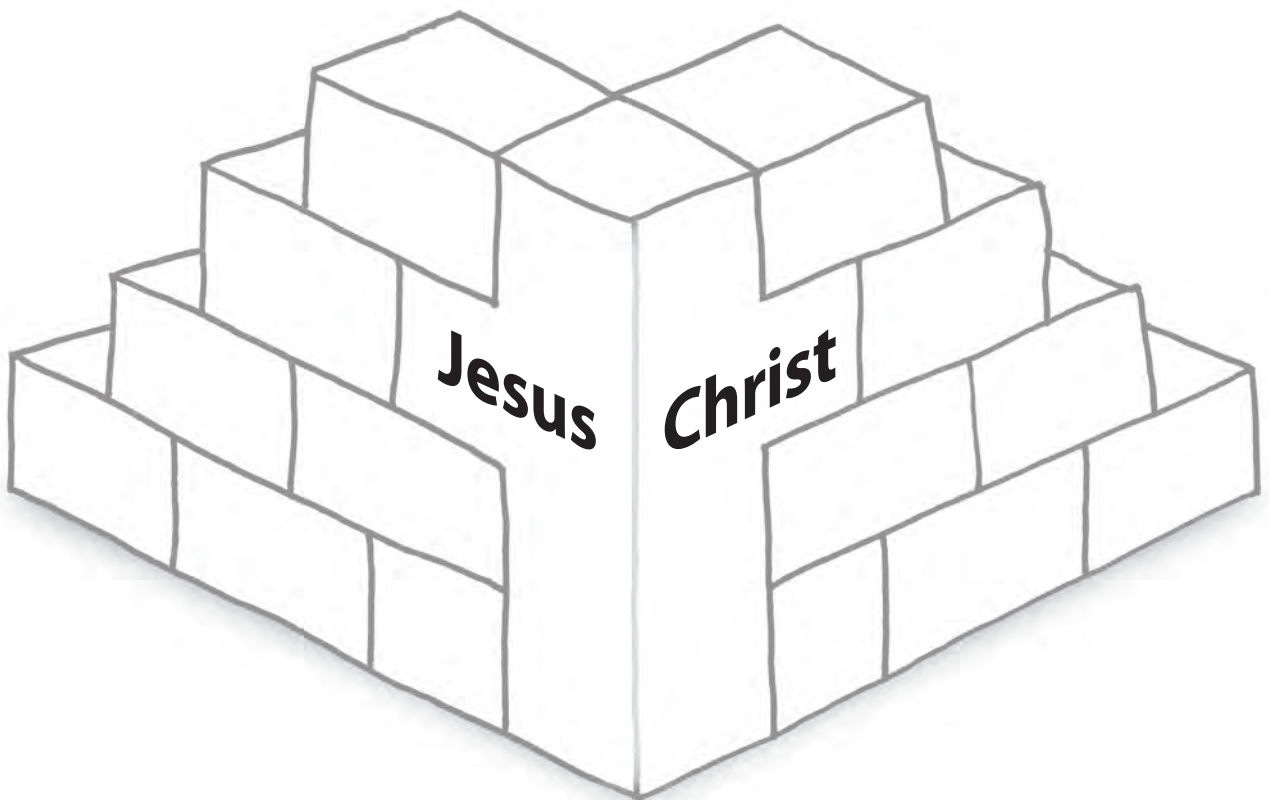




1 Peter 2:1–10
